










lueberry came into fruition through the impetus of Montreal muscian and businessman Danny Fonfeder, who invited George Morris, well-respected American luthier, and the revered Balinese woodcarver, Wayan Tuges to join forces to create something extraordinary. Their decision to combine their knowledge and expertise has made possible the existence of guitars with uncompromised beauty and sound.

Morris has been a respected teacher in the craft of making stringed instruments for over twenty-five years. He brings with him the experience and innovation that ensures Blueberry guitars are second to none as musical instruments. In turn, Tuges, world-acclaimed for his inspirational woodcarvings, contributes his artistic vision and breathes life into each guitar. On completion, each Blueberry is a work of exceptional brilliance.













American luthier and educator, George Morris, and Balinese woodcarver, Wayan Tuges, bring together two great craft traditions, combining the best of Western technology and expertise, with the best woodcarvers in the world. Their instruments literally embody a marriage of East and West and celebrate the joining of mind and spirit.

Many hands will add their expertise to a Blueberry before it is tested and judged ready for use. An experienced team of craftsmen, under the direction of Morris and Tuges, carefully carry out each step of this labor-intensive process in a limited production workshop in Bali, Indonesia. Utmost attention to detail is given to each and every part of the guitar to ensure that the best performing instruments are made.

Blueberry guitars are instruments of delicate precision. Because they are not mass-produced, they can afford to be finely braced for optimal performance. They are therefore noticeably richer in harmony, greater in sensitivity, more dynamic in range and possess superior sounds. A Blueberry serves the musician who aspires for greater artistic expression.










he best quality woods have been sourced throughout the world to be used at our workshops. African ebony, spruce, sycamore, East Indian rosewood, Maccagar ebony and maple have each been selected for their exceptional quality towards the final sound. The thin, hard finish that we use on our woods, very similar to French polish, but without the danger of softening or alcohol damage, never dampens the sound with too much weight. It won't crack, peel or chip and is especially wear resistant.

Playability is a major consideration when designing each guitar. All Blueberry fretboards are woodbound so the feel of the neck is always smooth and free of sharp frets. Hardwood laminates stiffen the neck, adding to the instrument's ability to hold its tune. We choose the woods used for lamination so they are consistent with the woods used on the instrument. There will be a consistent strip of ebony sanwiched between two pieces of wood that matches the wood used on the back. Set-up and intonation are always designed for playing ease and perfect tuning.













Opsimal Derformance



This is our largest, deepest instrument, just right for the flat-picking singer/songwriter, or bluegrass musician. Powerful, with a sonorous, crisp bass and clear, ringing trebles, it matches the intensity of the banjo and fiddle player, and its dynamic range perfectly complements vocal accompaniment.

Dreadnoughs

Most large, deep guitars tend to muddy the sound, at the expense of clear bass notes, and a clear definition overall. We think you will find that this is not the case with the Blueberry dreadnought. Notes are powerful but clear, with crispness throughout the tonal range, and balance across the board.

Grand Concers

This is a finger-picker's instrument. The smaller, shallower body is lighter on its feet, and quicker to respond to the subtlest nuance. It is bright and clear, and the greater separation of tones gives the finger-stylist a wider range of expression.

No lack of power here, however. The light, rounded body pumps sound very efficiently. And the deep waist stabilizes the instrument when played sitting down. This is a very nimble and expressive guitar worthy of the finest finger technique.

Classical

The Blueberry classical guitar is built for even response throughout the tonal range. It is not 'bass heavy' as are most. The slightly arched matrix bracing allows for a very light, but strong and stiff top. The sound is powerful, clean and fast on the attack, yet well rounded, and capable of great subtlety.


Available options:

Florentine cutaway

The cutaway option is useful for those who want more access to the upper frets. The curved Florentine design accommodates this with no interference where the neck joins the body. The edge of the fretboard is flush with the side for a seamless transition.

Ergonomic

We have all seen players craning their necks over the body of a guitar for a better view of the fretboard. With our ergonomic design, the body depth of the instrument tapers slightly towards the bass upper-bout, just enough to roll the guitar closer to him and bring the fretboard into full view. The player also experiences an instrument that appears thinner and more comfortable to play.



With conventional instruments, the player hears something different from what the audiencehears. The sound hole faces the audience, and they hear what comes out of the airchamber. The player, however, positioned behind the guitar, hears very little of this. The side port acts as a monitor, so that the player can hear the same full richness of sound that the audience hears.

Pickups: passive, active

Blueberry guitars can outfit steel-string instruments with either passive or active pick ups ready to be plugged into an amplifier, preamp, or mixing board. Both pickups are made by L.R. Baggs.

The passive model plugs into a preamp, or an amplifier with a low/highinput switch. It requires no batteries or maintenance. The active model comes with a battery-pack for a 9 volt battery installed inside the guitar on the end of the neck block, and a volume wheel installed inside the edge of the sound hole on the bass side. It has its own preamp and can be plugged directly into any amplifier.

Necks: mahogany, with centre laminates

of ebony, rosewood, bloodwood

Tops: spruce

Backs and sides: rosewood, maple, walnut,

cherry, mahogany, Tasmanian blackwood, padauk

Fret boards: ebony, rosewood, bloodwood; bound with ebony, or bloodwood


Bindings: ebony, rosewood, padauk, bloodwood

Rosettes: carved ebony

Inlays: jackfruit wood, mother of pearl, abalone

Headplates: carved ebony, rosewood
